
Flea Markets of New York

This flea market has been alive and well since the 1970s, and has a variety of vendors and dealers and hundreds of visitors each week. Named one of the top ten shopping streets in the world by National Geographic, Hell's Kitchen Flea Market (HKFM) sets a standard for distinctive vendors, a place where collectors and top-notch hagglers including the fashion éclat, artists, celebrities, tourists, and residents shop the market for antiques, collectibles, vintage clothing, mid-century modern items, home decorations, furniture, jewelry, and more.

Located on West 39th Street between 9th & 10th Avenues and open 9 a.m.-5 p.m. every Saturday and Sunday all year long (weather pending), the market's Hell's Kitchen South location is near the Port Authority Bus Terminal and Times Square. Over 100 vendors line the street at this famous market, which has even been featured in Vogue. - *Photo: curiosites-futilites-new-york.com*

4 Chelsea Antiques Garage / West 25th Street Market



New York City's booming real estate development finally caught up with the beloved Antiques Garage. It operated its last shopping weekend on June 28th-29th 2014. However, all Garage vendors are now located at the West 25th Street Market only half a block away from the Garage, between Sixth Avenue and Broadway, and Hell's Kitchen Flea Market.

The Antiques Garage was an indoor expansion of the original "Chelsea fleas" that started in 1976 on an empty corner lot with 11 vendors. These markets have been vital to the cultural fabric of New York City, world-renowned and loved by locals and tourists alike, including cultural icons Andy Warhol, Brad Pitt, Michael Jackson, Drew Barrymore, Barbara Streisand, Catherine Deneuve, among others.

A bastion of inspiration for the fashion coterie as well as artists, actors, designers, The Antiques Garage is always worth a visit.

5 Annex Antique Fair & Flea Market



The Annex Antique Flea offers visitors something more than just another Sunday spent shopping. This open-air flea market which harbors between 100 and 150 vendors depending on the weather and calendar, is based in the neighbourhood of Chelsea, one street away from the Chelsea Antique Garage which is a must do flea market if you're visiting New York City.

If you are a layman looking to kill some time at the market, chances are that you'll go home with something at the end of the day. For one thing, most decorative items sold at the Annex Antique Flea market are not massproduced, unoriginal copies that you see at the souvenir shops. If, on the other hand, you're an expert bargain hunter seriously looking for some real deal, you won't be disappointed. Speaking of bargain, remember that the rule at a "flea" is to never pay the original price. Always haggle it down to at least 50-60% of what the vendor asks for. You will end up with some valuable purchases. The market's asphalt gestalt lends itself to deep bargaining for low prices; bring cash and a practiced walk-away move.



7 Meeker Avenue Flea Market



If you happen to be in the neighborhood, and have time to kill, you should check out the Meeker Avenue Flea Market in Williamsburg. Over 80,000 square feet and expanding across two floors, the Meeker Avenue Flea Market offers enough furniture to outfit your entire apartment, and the pieces they carry are one-of-a-kind uniques that you couldn't find in IKEA. But don't expect to find here reasonably priced pieces to purchase for your house.

This place is not the most aesthetically pleasing (the whole place smells like cat's litter box), but if you know where to look and if you're armed with patience, you can still find many nice pieces - but nearly all of it overpriced. The ground floor is a little hit-andmiss (videos without cases, hairbrushes clogged up with hair, etc), but once you head up the stairs, you will discover that this place is crammed with mostly mid-century furniture and household items. Worth the dig if you don't mind putting a little « tender loving care » into a piece. - *Photo: Best Girl*



Established in 2003 as a weekly marketplace to bring emerging artists, indie designers, vintage collectors & enthusiasts and anyone seeking a place to show and sell together in a relaxed alt retail environment to network, Williamsburg Flea Market was fast embraced by the community. In a city full of creative and enterprising individuals, there was no real place that gave emerging and talented people the opportunity to set up for a day and sell in an environment that was friendly, fun, full of energy and enjoyed the rich and diverse pedestrian traffic that Williamsburg has.

The 10,000 square-foot market is just over the Williamsburg Bridge, a 10 minute walk from the Bedford stop on the L train as well as from the Marcy stop on the JMZ line. The space features a graffiti van, vintage tractor, bocce ball court and more. - *Photos: beaconscloset.com*





10 Brooklyn Flea



As the borough continues to rival and perhaps surpass Manhattan as a real estate hotbed and cultural epicenter, Brooklynites need a quality flea market of their own. After opening in 2008, the Brooklyn Flea has become the preeminent spot to score vintage furniture, décor, clothing and handmade goods. Last winter, the show expanded to include two weekly events: one is outdoors in the Fort Greene section of Brooklyn, the other is inside a former Brooklyn bank built in the 1920s. The historic landmark, known as One Hanson, has limestone and marble interiors, intricate mosaics and is a marvel in itself.

If you don't walk away with the perfect art deco vanity, you will leave with a full stomach. Food is a major focal point of the Brooklyn Flea, and you'll find one of the best smattering of tacos, cupcakes, lobster rolls, cannoli and Asian-inspired hot dogs in the country. 

Located on an elementary school playground, this Brooklyn neighborhood flea market features more than 30 local vendors. While the market puts an emphasis on vintage clothing and accessories, the merchants sell all sorts of things.

In addition to its 30 vintage, antique, handmade, and food vendors, the PS 321 Park Slope flea market also features free programming for kids of all ages courtesy of some of the finest youth organizations in Brooklyn. Visitors can stop by every weekend between Noon and 3pm and participate in mini-book-writing workshops by 826NYC, dance lessons by Mark Morris Dance Center, physics experiments by Carmelo the Science Fellow, recitals by Brooklyn Conservatory of Music students, and filmmaking by Reel Works.
